Role overview

The Environmental Compliance Advisor is a role that is central to the success of Tilt Renewables' strategic ambitions. It is an opportunity to play a critical role within a leading Australian renewables business to help drive the energy transition in Australia.

Reporting to the Environmental Compliance Manager, the purpose of this role is to support the team in ensuring environmental compliance of the operation of renewable generation projects and coordination of contractor data for sustainability reporting purposes. In addition, this role incorporates environmental and approval compliance activities through the construction and operation stages of projects.

This role will help facilitate the operation of renewable generation projects to enable Tilt Renewables to drive value by maintaining a high level of compliance for our renewable energy generation assets in Australia. Authentic and effective stakeholder management and interaction is a critical aspect of this role.

Key Accountabilities

The key accountabilities may include (but are not limited to):

- Environmental Management and Compliance: Manage assigned planning and environmental compliance to agreed outcomes. Support the development, implementation and maintenance of robust environmental compliance policies and systems. Work with operations and environment teams to ensure environmental compliance across the site(s), meeting relevant planning and environmental approval obligations, legislation and associated regulation, codes of practice and applicable Australian standards. Environmental mediation processes satisfactorily resolved without a materially adverse impact on development or operational projects. Oversee environmental monitoring programs associated with the implementation of key management plans, obligations, or business objectives (such as cultural heritage, ecology, water, waste, noise etc.). Establish and maintain environmental registers, including permitting and approval compliance, monitoring, audits, and performance. Review and analyse environmental technical reports with reference to project compliance / risks and opportunities, and stakeholder expectations. Propose solutions to address environmental aspects & impacts and opportunities. Support the development and implementation of systems and procedures, along with the provision of any required advice and training, to ensure ongoing compliance. Implementation of a program of environmental compliance audits/reviews of the operational portfolio.
- Health, Safety and Environment and Compliance: Adherence to company policies with a strong focus on the environment, health, and safety. Support a proactive approach to health and safety that promotes safe environment for self and others. All projects supported or managed with HSE



as a key focus for all internal and external parties. Assist with the monitoring of contractor HSE systems and compliance to drive superior safety and environmental performance. Investigate incidents, hazards and issues.

- Environmental Policy and Legislation: Monitor environmental policy legislation, national and regional planning frameworks and relevant technical information for the purpose of protecting or enhancing business interests. Support a clear and strategic position for the business on national and regional level environmental policy and manage the company's response to ensure positive policy outcomes for the business. Support the review, analysis and assessment of regulatory documents and preparation of submissions to protect and enhance its interests.
- **Stakeholder Management**: Supporting interactions with key stakeholders including consultants, industry, regulators, councils, NGO's, cultural heritage groups, landowners and the wider community, where required.
