Dundonnell Wind Farm snapshot

- Up to 104 wind turbines
- Total tip height of up to 165 metres
- Total electricity generation potential about 300MWs
- Wind farm land area about 4000 ha

A progress update

With Project Manager Chris Righetti

Throughout 2013 works have continued in line with the EES Scoping Guidelines; standards which document the surveys and assessments required to fulfill the EES process. Concurrently we've been working on any additional requirements to achieve a planning permit application.

- Survey works on site have included, but are not limited to, vegetation surveys, migratory bird, bat, and Brolga surveys, Traffic Impact Assessments, quarry assessments and noise assessments.
- Discussions and consultation continue with neighbouring landholders, government agencies and other stakeholders on the proposed project and planning application assessments.
- The majority of the powerline corridor to the Mortlake Power Station has been secured.
- Preparation of EES and Planning Permit Application documents have commenced. Submission is expected during the second guarter next year.
